

Precepting in the Setting Where you Work

- You must have a conversation with your Program Director to formally approve your plan to complete your preceptorship in the same setting where you work. The Program Director will document this conversation.
- You must meet with your preceptor(s) ahead of the term to discuss how you will navigate competing priorities (such as wanting to assist your nurse colleagues and needing rest during a student shift) and what role your preceptor will play in assisting you with this.
- Except in an emergency, in the event that a Student NP cares for a patient in the student role, they should not care for that patient as the primary RN in the same admission.
- A student must always wear ID that clearly identifies them in the role they are working at the time.
- We encourage students to discuss their plan with their nurse managers/direct supervisors to identify potential role conflicts specific to that unit and have a plan to avoid them. (An example would be for a NICU RN who attends a birth as a Student Nurse Midwife, it would likely not be advisable to be assigned the care for that infant as an RN should they be transferred to the NICU. This is a conversation that should take place before the semester.)
