• It is acceptable to work with one preceptor for your practicum experience.

• Preceptors and acceptable practicum sites cannot be perceived to have a conflict of interest as relates to evaluation of the student. For example, acceptable preceptors cannot be related to the student. Any practicum placement opportunity must be vetted through the program director and clinical site coordinator to ensure that a conflict of interest does not exist. It is at the discretion of the program director which practicum sites and preceptors are appropriate for practicum courses.

• To be enrolled in Practicum courses, a clinical site must be secured by the end of the second week of the term. If students have not secured a practicum site by this time, they are unlikely to be successful in completing the course requirements. To avoid financial penalty, and receive the 100% tuition refund, students must withdraw from the Practicum course by the drop date for that specific term. Otherwise, students could be subject to administrative withdrawal and/or subject to failure of the course for inability to meet course requirements.

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
